

Leominster Primary School: Sports Premium Plan 2019-20 and impact

What is the Sports Premium?

The PE and Sports Premium grant is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. The Government has allocated Sports Premium money since 2013-14 to schools.

The funding is jointly provided by the Department for Education, Health and Culture and Media and Sport. It will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and P.E; for 2019-20 each school will receive £16,000 plus an extra £10 per pupil from Years 1 to 6. The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Purpose of the funding

Schools will spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this. Examples include additional sport clubs, equipment to support P.E and hiring specialist P.E teachers/qualified sport coaches.

At Leominster Primary School we recognise the contribution of P.E to the health and well-being of the children. In addition, it is considered that an innovative and varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all children.

During 2019-20 we received £20,730 and carried over £14,854 from 18-19 (£35,584 in total).
