READING

Your child's reading journey is monitored by us through the use of the 'Accelerated Reader' programme. Although there are some opportunities for them to read their individual books within the school timetable, it is crucial for them to read regularly at home - daily, wherever possible. It is wonderful when parents/carers are able to spend some time sharing this experience with them, but we do ask that you ensure your child reads for a sustained period (e.g. 20 minutes) as frequently as possible.

Children should read ONE BOOK at a time, bringing it into school and taking it home each day. When they finish their book, they will complete an 'Accelerated Reader' quiz, at school, providing their teacher with a record of their individual reading journey.



MATHS

In year 5, pupils should know all of their multiplication and division facts up to 12x12.

If they are not completely secure with all of these, it is essential that they continue learning and practising these, at home as well as at school.
