Curriculum and topic this term:

English: This term the children will be exploring the features of **non-chronological reports** and will write a non-chronological report on everything they have learnt about the Egyptians. They will also explore **fantasy stories** and will be given the opportunity to write their very own fantasy story.

Maths: In mathematics this term we will be following the objectives outlined in the National Curriculum.

Science: Our science topic for this term is '**States of Matter**'. Within this topic the children will compare and group materials together, according to whether they are solids, liquids or gases. Pupils will observe that some materials change state when they are heated and cooled. They will also identify the part played by evaporation and condensation in the water cycle.

Topic: Our topic for this term is the **'Ancient Egyptians'**. Within this topic, the children will learn when events from Ancient Egypt took place; the importance of the River Nile and understand what life was like as an Ancient Egyptian. The children will also design and make their own Egyptian burial masks and Egyptian musical instruments.

French: The children will complete 30 minutes of French a week focusing on a wide range of different topics.

Computing: This term the children will learn how to use Microsoft Excel; the children will collect and present mathematical/scientific data and present it in the form of a graph or chart.

Cultural Diversity Workshop

On **Thursday 8th February**, we have 'Creative Workshops Unlimited' coming into school to deliver a workshop to our children. The title of the workshop is called, 'Travelling the World' and it brings colonial history alive and helps to explain immigration patterns in a simple but relevant way. It uses interactive storytelling, simple role play, artefacts, hands-on activities and singing to convey an important message. By the end, pupils should be better equipped to understand, empathise with and relate to people of other cultures and races in this country.



Egyptian Day

On **Wednesday 10th January**, Year 4 pupils will enjoy a fun filled, Egyptian themed day! The children will meet up with Aesop's dotty professor and her faithful companion on the banks of the Nile. They will enjoy the thrills and spills as they venture into ancient Egypt and stagger upon the secrets of the pyramids. Not only that, but the children will also enjoy a performance based on life as an Egyptian! There is no charge for this workshop – the workshop has been kindly funded by the PTA.
