Highlights from last term...

The children thoroughly enjoyed their visit to Ludlow Assembly Rooms. The children were beautifully behaved and the film was fantastic!

Curriculum and topic this term:

English: This term the children will be writing a **suspense narrative**. They will also be working on using **persuasive techniques** in their writing. This will involve writing different persuasive letters which use **informal** and **formal language**.

Maths: In mathematics this term we will be following the objectives outlined in the National Curriculum. Our main foci for this term will be **Fractions, Decimals, Percentages and Measurements.** We will also be focusing more on reasoning within our maths lessons.

Science: Our science topic for the term is **'Animals including humans'**. Within this topic, the children will identify and name the main parts of the human circulatory system, and describe the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood. They will also recognise the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their bodies function and describe the ways in which nutrients and water are transported within animals, including humans.

Topic: Our learning question for our topic this term is **'How do landscapes change? Earthquakes'**. In this topic, we will learn about tectonic plates and name and locate key countries along plate boundaries. We will look - in detail - at how and why earthquakes start and how land use has changed over time in the areas most affected.

PSHE: This term, the children will be will be thinking about their emotional and mental health. The children will identify a range of emotions and times when they might have experienced these. We will consider some simple self-care techniques, including the importance of rest, exercise, spending time with friends and family and the benefit of hobbies and interests. They will consider where they can seek help and support, if it is needed.

R.E: This term we shift focus from Hinduism to Christianity. Our big question is, '**What did Jesus do to save human beings?**' The children will explore the connections between the Christian belief in Jesus' death as a sacrifice and how Christians celebrate Holy Communion/Lord's Supper.

Computing: In our computing lessons, we will be learning about '**Blogging**'. We will explore what a blog is and what they are used for. The children will look at what makes a good blog and then write and publish their own blogs!

French: Our unit of work is titled '**As-tu un animal?**' (Do you have a pet?). Children will work on repeating, recognising and spelling a selection of pets in French. They will learn how to tell somebody in French if they have a pet as well as asking somebody if they have a pet.

DT: In DT, the children will research a variety of playgrounds. They will design a range of structures, improve and add detail to their structures and add a surrounding landscape.

Reminders

Please help us to keep your children fit and healthy by ensuring that they bring their PE uniform into school for their PE sessions.

6F and 6CL have PE on Monday (please note, this is different to the autumn term).



6P have PE on Friday.

Children being excused from physical education for a medical reason should bring a note.

If your child is **asthmatic** please could you ensure that they have an inhaler, labelled with their name, in school <u>at all times!</u>

As many of you already know, we are a healthy eating school and we would like to remind you that children should only bring in fruit to eat at break times. It is also very important children have a water bottle in school – we strongly encourage children to drink plenty of water throughout the day. Water helps keep them hydrated but also improves their levels of concentration and learning.



UNIFORM

All pupils are required to wear school uniform. Can we remind you that this is: purple jumper (not PE hoodie), white or purple polo shirt both with or without logo, grey trousers or shorts, grey skirt or grey pinafore. On the children's PE day, **they will change into their PE uniform in school,** which is: grey/black joggers or shorts, a purple t-shirt, a purple PE hoodie or jumper and trainers. When children have gymnastics, it is advisable for them to wear shorts. Please ensure all uniform is clearly named. We will be going out for PE regardless of the weather conditions. Therefore, please ensure you provide your children with appropriate clothing. All uniform can be purchased from Club Sport. Earrings are required to be taken out or covered over with tape on PE days.
